



## Kids Rule

It's 3001, and things are very different. That's because kids are in charge of the world. The streets are filled with bicycles. There is a toy store on every corner. And having fun is the golden rule.




Outside, people young and old are jumping in puddles and splashing around. Everyone is laughing...everyone except for Bianca's dad, that is. He brushes mud from his coat.

"What a mess!" he complains. "What a terrible day! I have so much work to do. And now it is raining."


